



Double Eagle II Airport

Double Eagle II Airport was opened in 1983 on Albuquerque's west mesa as a new general aviation reliever airport to replace several other smaller airports located around the city. The airport was named after the Double Eagle II hot air balloon, the first to cross the Atlantic Ocean and piloted by three local balloonists. Double Eagle II Airport handles most types of non-scheduled general aviation as well as events and airshows such as the annual Land of Enchantment Fly, sponsored by the Experimental Aircraft Association, held in September each year. Double Eagle II is managed under the Albuquerque International Sunport.
