

Raton Municipal Airport

Raton Municipal Airport, also known as Raton Municipal/Crews Field, is a general aviation airport serving Raton and eastern Colfax County, New Mexico. It has two paved runways and is located 12 miles southwest of Raton. The airport accommodates small jets and receives about a dozen aircraft operations per day. It is occasionally used as an alternate airport to Trinidad, Colorado for **Bemidji Airlines**, an air cargo carrier that provides feeder service for UPS between Denver and Trinidad. Raton saw commercial airline service in the early 1950's by **Continental Airlines** using Douglas DC-3 aircraft on flights to Denver, Albuquerque, and El Paso. Other smaller commuter airlines including **Trans Central**, **S.I. Airways**, **Mountain Air**, and **Territorial Airlines**, provided occasional service from the late 1960's through 1990.
